Dear St. Elphin's Old Girl,

Although this News Letter probably will not reach you until March, it is infact still January as I put pen to paper and so I feel I can begin by wishing you all a very happy 1987.

On the whole I have enjoyed my first year as Secretary of the S.E.O.G.G. and would like to thank all of you who have sent good wishes to me. I have been very pleased to receive your interesting letters and to pass on news and information where possible.

Many of you have sent donations to the Guild and we are most grateful for these. As you will see when you read the report on the 1986 Reunion, it was decided to raise the life subscription from £10 to £20. Most of you will only have paid £10, so if any of you feel like donating £5 to the Guild we would be delighted to receive your cheques! May I remind you to make all cheques payable to S.E.O.G.G., please, and to send them to R. Chambers, C/o. St. Elphin's School. While asking for your money I have to tell you that the 1986 magazines, for which those of you who are receiving them paid £2 + 30p p. & p. - actually cost £3 per copy. The Bursar tells me that the price was not known in advance and therefore a bill of £2 per copy, as in previous years, was expected. When the price turned out to be £3 per copy this year, the funds of the O.G.G. had to stand the difference. Therefore I would be grateful if all of you receiving the magazine would please send me the extra £1.

You will also read in the Reunion Report that it was decided to try inviting definite decades of Old Girls to attend the September Reunions to try to encourage more people to come (numbers were disappointingly low this year, especially as we had such a lovely day). It was thought that if Old Girls knew their own contemporaries would be at a certain reunion, they would be more likely to come. I am therefore asking for volunteers, anyone at St. Elphin's between 1965-75, who would be willing to write to other O.Gs. of the same decade living in her area to encourage them to come to St. Elphin's on September 19th 1987. If you are willing to do this please get in touch with me and I will send you a list of names and addresses.

We are also going to try holding a Spring Reunion in London this year. It will be on SATURDAY, MAY 9th at the OXFORD and CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY CLUB, 71 PALL MALL, LONDON SW1Y 5HD., from 2.30 p.m. - 5.30 p.m.. The cost will be £5-5.50 per head (depending on nos.) and this will include afternoon tea which will be served at 3.30p.m. The committee of the Friends of St. Elphin's has recently provided the school with an excellent display of photographs and information about St. Elphin's for promotional use. The Friends are going to mount this display at the London Reunion and some of them will be present, along with the Headmaster and some of the sixth form girls to give up-to-date information about the School. I am sure this will prove most

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interesting to any of you who have not been able to visit St. Elphin's recently. Because this display will be on view at the reunion, the Headmaster would be very pleased if you would invite any friends you have who are looking for private education for their daughters and who might be interested in St. Elphin's, to come along, and especially any of you who might be thinking of letting your daughters follow in your own footsteps by sending them to St. Elphin's. Lady Sybil Osmond (nee Wells 1925-32) is a member of the Oxford and Cambridge University Club and has arranged this reunion for us. She has accommodation for a few members if anyone requires it. If you are interested in attending this Reunion please fill in the enclosed appropriate form, return it to me and I will send you further details plus directions on how to find the Club.

Now, how many keen golfers have we? Dear Old Girls,

It's just a year since I last wrote to you in this way. As many of you will know, my wife died last October, having lost her long battle against cancer. From the start she made no secret of her illness, and her courage in facing its awful reality while never losing her faith or optimism has inspired everyone connected with the School. Your kind letters after she died were much appreciated and I wanted you to know this, and also what the School has meant to me during the past few months. Hilary's last 'official' School function was the Reunion in September. She enjoyed talking to Miss Robinson - it was lovely to have her with us on this occasion - and meeting you all. Our seven years together at St. Elphin's formed a large part of our married life. During that time we grew to love the School and all it stands for, and it will now remain the centre of my working life. My sons are happy at school in Shrewsbury and there are increasing challenges for girls' schools to face and overcome as we move towards the close of this century.

At the last Reunion I was able to give good news of the School's academic progress. The 'A' and 'O' level results in 1986 were excellent: 14 A grade passes at 'A' Level were our best ever, as were the 90 A grades gained at 'O' level. 15 girls obtained university or polytechnic places, in a wide range of subjects, and a reasonable number of last year's Upper Fifth Form have moved into the Sixth Form, giving hope of further academic success in 1988. That year will also show us how successfully we have been preparing the girls for the new G.C.S.E. examinations.

These results, and a lovely new prospectus, produced with the help and generosity of the Friends, formed the basis of a new school year begun in a spirit of justified optimism and well-being. This has continued in two ways: our new Infants' Department is proving most popular, and at the time of writing has already grown in only a few months from 5 - 25 children, girls and boys, and the need for a second qualified assistant. Secondly, with the help of the Friends we have arranged a series of promotional evenings, so far in Chesterfield, South Normanton, Sheffield, Lincoln and Derby, to make the School more widely known. That tiresome but necessary phrase 'aggressive marketing' rings daily in my ears. I think we are 'promoting' ourselves as we should, and naturally hope that you can help us in any ways you can - best of all, of course, by sending your daughters and granddaughters to YOUR school. I'm looking forward to the planned Reunion in London, on May 9th, when we hope to show you our stylish new display boards, which present an appealing picture of the School in the 80s.

Certainly it keeps us all busy. Music, drama, games and fund-raising activities have again been at the forefront of our extra-curricular life. There was a splendid production of "The Boy Friend", the juniors tackled "The Water Babies", we gave many concerts, both in School and farther afield, our programme of sports fixtures grew last year, with increased emphasis on netball, and having decided to support the Chesterfield Ashgate Hospice Appeal, I know you'll be pleased to learn that we have already raised well over £1,000 for this. All these events and activities were well described in "The Elphinian" 1986, and I hope you have seen

copies of this magazine which gave a comprehensive account of how we spent our time in School. Already this year we have produced the melodrama "Maria Marten" - with spirited audience participation, for the play demands this - and also "Alice in Wonderland" in the Junior School. Two Open Days are planned for the Summer Term:

- for the Senior School, on Saturday, 16th May, from 9.30 a.m. - Noon.
- for the Junior School, on Saturday, 4th July, from 2 - 5 p.m.

YOU WOULD BE MOST WELCOME TO ATTEND THESE FUNCTIONS.

In my last letter, I mentioned the Rev'd David Prytherch's return to parish life. Several members of Staff left St. Elphin's last summer, most significantly perhaps for Old Girls, Miss Jean Marsden, Senior Mistress, Head of Geography and a member of Staff here for 24 years. Miss Marsden has moved to become Deputy Head of a school in Norway, a country which she has visited often, and she writes enthusiastically of her new life there. 24 years may seem a long span, but what of Mrs. Elsie Gascoigne, who retired last summer after a mere 38 years on the domestic staff here! Such unbroken loyal service is rare for these days. In thanking these former members of the Staff, and Rosemary Chambers, Rosemary Taylor, Sybil Osmond and all those in the Guild who do so much to preserve and promote St. Elphin's, I close by sending my very best wishes to you all. Derbyshire may seem bleak and cold at this moment, but it is a lovely county in which to live and work - and also to be educated in!

REUNION 20TH SEPTEMBER 1986

The weather was perfect for the 1986 reunion, showing St. Elphin's and Derbyshire at their very best. Old friends greeted each other over a cup of coffee, about 40 Old Girls with friends and family being present. Children and friends not attending the A.G.M. went off to watch a "James Bond" video while the rest of the gathering moved to the Common Room for the meeting.

Mr. Pollard, our President, opened the A.G.M. with prayers and then welcomed all present. The minutes of the 1985 meeting were read and passed. There were no matters arising.

The Treasurer's Report was read and passed. The retirement of the Treasurer, Rosemary Taylor, was accepted with regret and the meeting expressed their most sincere thanks to her for all the work she had done for the Guild. Rosemary was not able to be present at the meeting and it was agreed to send her a letter of thanks. No one from the meeting volunteered to take over the post of Treasurer so it was agreed that Rosemary Chambers, Secretary, should combine both jobs until a member of the Guild could be found to take over this work. It was reported that the Governors had given £200 to the O.G.G. in spring 1986 to help with running costs. Sybil Osmond queried the necessity of a regular grant from the Governors and suggested that the subscription should go up. Following general discussion an increase in life subscription from £10 to £20 was formally proposed by Margaret Joslin and seconded by Joan Kiddell, this was passed. The Headmaster reported an increase in the number of leaving girls joining the Guild and it was agreed to add the subscription of the O.G.G. to the final account of all leaving girls, to be crossed out by them if they did not wish to join.

The Headmaster's Report followed. This was an exciting account of the School's many and varied successes during 1985-86, which you will find in his letter to you.

The Secretary then gave her Report and a discussion followed on the merits of having a St. Elphin's Old Girls' badge or scarf. It was decided that the possibility of a new badge should be looked into. It was also decided to try inviting definite "years" to come to the Autumn Reunion, starting with the 1965-75 decade. Of course all members would be welcome to the reunion, but it was suggested that someone from the chosen decade in each area should be asked to write to other members in her area who were at St. Elphin's during 1965-75 to encourage them to come to the reunion. It was agreed that the next reunion at St. Elphin's should be on Saturday, September 19th 1987.

Mr. Pollard read out the following letters:- An obituary for Rita Hilary Cooke from her mother. News of an old minute book from Dorothy Maye, nee Bash, who was Guild Secretary in the 1960's. News of Frances Watson, nee Smith; Eileen Smart had memories of her. Also a plea for funds for further education from Susan Milroy, an ex.pupil, but after discussion it was decided not to grant this

request as a precedent could not be set. It was agreed that a fund for this sort of thing might be started in the future if finances improved.

It was agreed to hold a reunion in London in May 1987. Details elsewhere in News Letter.

The programme for the rest of the day was given and the meeting closed.

After a delicious lunch the afternoon was spent watching school hockey matches, wandering round buildings and grounds and listening to the beautiful Bosendorfer piano being expertly played for us by the Music Master while we sat on the terrace and had tea in the sunshine.

Evensong was held in the Chapel at 4.15 p.m. The lessons were read by Sarah Straw and Miss Robinson. This rounded off a perfect day and our thanks go to all the staff at St. Elphin's, especially the Bursar, who helped to make our reunion possible and successful.

TREASURERS' REPORT FOR 1985

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I offer my sincere apologies for absence. The spirit is very willing but the flesh rather weaker. May be one day I shall have another good leg to cope with all the stairs! I have put in my resignation from the treasury. After all these years, it is time for a new face. I hope someone will be found to carry on as from the beginning of 1987.

Obituaries

Pauline Alice O'Brian Thomas (nee Thompson) was at St. Elphin's from January 1951-July 1955. She went on to college to gain a Diploma of Institutional Management and in 1958 was married to Neville Jones. She was widowed in 1965 and left with two children aged five and three. She remarried to Adrian Thomas in 1968 and leaves a school girl daughter. Pauline had an operation for cancer in 1985 but inspite of modern treatments she had rapid evidence of secondaries and was fully aware of her condition. She had the happiness of seeing her elder daughter Joanna (an S.R.N.) married in Miskin Church, Mid. Glamorgan, by special licence before she entered the Marie Curie Hospice in Penarth where she died on April 22nd 1986. The funeral service on April 26th was at Miskin and amongst the family and friends were staff from the boarding school for Spastic Children where Pauline, up to 1985, had been Caterer for many years.

It is with the deepest regret that I have to report the death of Hilary Pollard, the wife of St. Elphin's headmaster.

Many of you who are reading this News Letter never had the pleasure of meeting Hilary, but those of you who did will, I know, share the great sadness and sense of loss of all her friends and would wish to convey your sympathy to her family, husband Peter and sons Hugh and Ben.

I feel privileged to say I was one of Hilary's friends. She was a remarkable person, facing her illness from cancer with a courage, bravery, optimism and faith only matched by that of her husband. She was never afraid to talk about her illness but always made light of it. She died in October 1986, having been present at the Old Girls' Reunion in the September.

Hilary was always welcoming and cheerful, quickly putting new-comers to St. Elphin's at their ease. She was also a very talented lady being an accomplished musician who frequently accompanied pupils at St. Elphins on musical occasions. Above all, she was an inspiration to all who knew her.
