GENERAL INFORMATION

Admission

The Headmistress is always pleased to meet parents and their daughters, and to arrange for them to see round the School and answer any queries they may have.

There is no entrance examination for those joining the pre-school and infant departments. Admission at the age of 8 plus to 10 plus is by means of the Junior Entrance Examination. Girls entering between 11 plus and 13 plus sit either the scholarship examinations, or the School's own entrance examination. Admission to the Sixth Form is dependent upon the results obtained in the GCSE examination and a report from the girl's previous school and an interview with the Headmistress.

Clothes

The School uniform, which is worn during weekdays by all girls with the exception of infants and those in the Sixth Form, consists of a blue/green tartan skirt with a white blouse and green blazer. Boarders may wear casual clothes after school hours. The School's outfitters are Lady Fair, Matlock. A clothing exchange shop is organised within the School and we are always pleased to offer help as necessary.

Travel Arrangements

Escorts are provided for groups of girls travelling at the beginning and end of term and at half-term, with a member of staff accompanying girls, usually by coach to Heathrow and to St Pancras. Parents or guardians are responsible for girls' travel arrangements after that point.

Exeats

At half-term the school is closed and all girls go home or to their guardians. In addition there are certain exeat weekends when boarders may sleep away from the School. Boarders may also take "tea visits" on a Saturday or Sunday, being out from mid-morning until 8-30pm. Girls in the Sixth Form are allowed two extra optional exeats each term.

Health

The health of the girls is in the overall charge of the qualified resident nursing sister and housemistresses. The School doctor holds a surgery at the School twice a week or whenever required. In the case of an accident or serious illness where emergency treatment is required, every effort will be made to obtain parental approval prior to treatment. However, should this not be possible, the Headmistress or her nominee acting in loco parentis will give consent for such treatment (including anaesthetic or an operation) as may be recommended by a doctor.

Friends of St Elphin's

"The Friends" is an association of parents both current and past, old girls, staff and governors, which helps and supports the School in many ways. Details of the Friends' activities and fund-raising events are forwarded to parents from time to time.

A Deposit of £300 is required on acceptance of a place. This will be deducted from the first fee account.

- Dyslexia lessons: £19 per hour
- English as a Foreign Language: £19 per hour

Horse riding, tennis coaching, ballet, golf and driving lessons can also be arranged and will be charged as incurred.

A Term's notice of withdrawal of a pupil is required in writing to the Headmistress, otherwise full fees for the ensuing term are payable.

A Half-term's notice is required for the discontinuing of lessons in extra subjects. To be given by half-term to take effect from start of the new term.

Casual boarding charges for day pupils: £14 per night, bed, breakfast and evening meal.

"The school may charge interest on fees or other amounts not paid when due and it will do so at the rate of 3% per annum over the base lending rate of National Westminster Bank plc from time to time in force calculated from one month from the fees or other amounts falling due".

SCHOLARSHIPS AND EXHIBITIONS

Senior School Entrance Awards

External or Internal Candidates

Two Scholarships £1500 per year

Two Performing Arts Scholarships £1500 per year, plus free tuition in two musical instruments or Speech and Drama or Singing

These awards, tenable up to and including Year 11, are available to candidates over 10 years of age and under 14 on 1st September annually following the Scholarship examination, which takes place in January.

Sixth Form Awards

External or Internal Candidates

Two Scholarships £1800 per year

For external or internal candidates, these will be awarded on the basis of a written examination to be taken in January each year for entry to the Lower Sixth Form in September of that year.

Special Awards

(1) Tom Bower Memorial Award

(2) Award for the daughter/granddaughter of an Old Girl of St Elphin's School

Other Information

If candidates of sufficient merit do not appear, not all awards will be granted.

It is hoped that candidates joining the school as scholars will remain at St Elphin's for Sixth Form education.

The School reserves the right to remove an award from any candidate whose academic progress is deemed unsatisfactory as she moves through the school.

Further particulars and entry forms are available from the Headmistress.

Entry should be made at least three weeks before the examination.

CURRICULUM SUMMARY FOR THE SENIOR SCHOOL

Years 7 to 9:

Some subjects are taught in sets; all girls follow the same broad curriculum:

English, Drama, Mathematics, Sciences, French, Latin/Classical Civilisation, History, Geography, Religious Education, Music, Art, Technology (Food, Textiles), Information Technology, Physical Education, Swimming. German and Careers are begun in Year 9.

Years 10 and 11:

Pupils study a core of compulsory subjects to GCSE :

English, Mathematics and Dual Science. (English Literature is taken by the majority; where appropriate extra English lessons are provided). They will also continue to have lessons in PE, IT, RE and Careers. In addition to the core subjects pupils make a choice of options, usually four subjects, from the following:

Art, Classical Civilisation, French, German, Geography, History, Latin, Music, PE and Textiles.

Years 12 and 13:

Pupils may choose from a wide range of A Levels, AS Levels, Advanced GNVQ and additional GCSEs. Usually girls study the equivalent of three A Levels and follow a General Studies course which includes Key Skills and Health and Life Skills.
